

The Age (February 2023): State schools dominate list of NAPLAN high achievers

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The schools with Victoria's most improved NAPLAN results over the past four years have been revealed, and government schools make up 16 of the state's top-20 performers, alongside four schools in the independent and Catholic sectors.

Schools with a high proportion of students from first-generation migrant families also dominated the list of high achievers. Between 60 per cent and 90 per cent of students were from non-English-speaking backgrounds in every school in the top 10.

Schools in less advantaged communities including Dandenong, St Albans, Springvale and Braybrook registered heavily in the top 20, including the school with the best NAPLAN results in the state.

Top Ten has an extremely high proportion of member schools in Dandenong, St Albans, Thomastown and Cranbourne (more than half of the state schools in these regions).

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority’s ranking of Victorian school NAPLAN results is based on those that achieved the highest and most consistent rate of progress in literacy and numeracy. Dandenong North Primary, a public school in Melbourne’s south-east where 70 per cent of pupils are classified as disadvantaged, has the best NAPLAN results in Victoria, data from the Australian Curriculum and Assessment Authority shows.
